

About the National Workshop on Human Rights: Concept, Challenges and Enforcement Mechanism (Inter-disciplinary workshop)

Humanity felt necessity of Human Rights even from the day when a human being started entering into the state of 'society politic' from its 'primitive and post primitive life'. Humanity has witnessed the eras of its transformation from the natural rights to the civil and political rights and the socio-economic rights. An experience reveals that even after a long march of first-generation of rights to second, second to third and third to the stage of undeveloped theories of rights i.e. rights concerned with peace and solidarity. This March could not provide an effective shield to protect human rights throughout the world irrespective of nations, societies, groups based on different considerations.

There is a mandate under the "Universal Declaration of Human Rights, 1948" to include the Human Rights Education in the curriculars at school level and in the Higher Education System. This mandate could not bring desirable results till 1995. When the UNO has decided to celebrate 50 years of its creation in the year 1995. The UN gave a call to starts Human Right Education throughout the world. Therefore, the call of Human Rights Education becomes a matter of concern for Educationists throughout the world to think for introduction of Human Rights Education at school level and Higher Education Level in this world.

This call becomes important and significant for the reason that this comes from the United Nations Organizations. This does receive significance because the call is concerned with the rights relating to the life, liberty, equality and dignity of a human being.

In India, the human education did start from 1995 at the level of colleges and universities. This is unfortunate to note that even after the laps of a period of 27 years, we are failed to improve the human right education in the society and failed further to educate our society literate and common to understand the real concept of human rights. The situation has resulted in this manner for the several reasons including the casual involvement of serious teachers and scholars to educate the target groups, dearth of literature and failure in preparing such literature, casual approach in research, teaching and learning, emergence of NGOs having no experience and expertise in understanding and dealing with the concept and problems of human rights.

This upshots into the development of the concept of Human Right itself in a casual and precarious manner. People who are actively engaged in teaching, learning, practicing and administration of Human Rights themselves experience small victories and large frustrations when immerse into ocean of the documents and instruments concerned with Human Rights. The situation requires serious, systematic and responsible teaching to understand the concept of Human Rights, Challenges and its Enforcement Mechanism. The proposed National Workshop is being organized to achieve this goal.

About the University

The Institute of Advanced Studies in Education (Deemed to be University) has a proud past stretching back to 1950 when the petite Gandhi Vidya Mandir, the parent Institution, was established in the desert land of Sardarshahar. The foundation stone of the Rural University was laid down by the first president of India Dr. Rajendra Prasad in 1955. The Institute of Advanced Studies in Education (Deemed to be University) (hereafter IASE) is an institution born out of the dedication of the founder Shri Kanhaiyalal Dugar (Later known as Swami Shri Ramsharan ji Maharaj). It emerged as a public university in 2002, when it got the formal recognition of Deemed to be University, under section 3 of the UGC Act 1956. It is duly

accredited by NAAC as well. Today, the university is a vibrant centre of research and academics as it is rooted in a value-based education. Since its inception with a handful of students, the institution has slowly grown into a giant tree imparting education from primary to a post-doctoral level having three faculties, namely, Faculty of Education, Faculty of Engineering & Technology and Faculty of Humanities & Social Sciences. The sprawling 100 acres of the university campus is a verdant oasis in the lap of an intense desert. It is dotted by large parks, gardens, playgrounds, auditoria, cultural and spiritual centre.

About Sardarshahar

Sardarshahar is located in North western part of the Rajasthan state in the heart of Thar desert in Churu district. A tiny village named Rajiawas, in the erstwhile state of Bikaner, was picked up by His Highness Sir Ratan Singh to develop into a city after the name of his loving son Sardar Singh in 1838. The area was perhaps ruled by the Mohils of that time. A statue of Indrapal Mohil at the town side is a testimony to the fact. It is known for its grand havelis with beautiful frescoes work. Its white marble clock tower is remarkable for its unique architecture. The town is also famous for its architecture and wall painting. The town also has some religious places like Ram Manch, Ichchhapurna Balaji Temple, Samadhi Sthal-(Shanti Peeth) of Acharya Shri Mahapragya. It is the birthplace of Eleventh Acharya (Religious head)-Acharyashri Mahashramanji of Shri Jain Terapanthi Sect.


